## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL (Supporting NCAI Recommendations - ANA)

RES. NO. 100-80

WHEREAS, the Papago Community Action Program has reported certain recommenda-1 tions to the Papago Council which were supported by the Human Resource 2 Committee of the National Congress of American Indians concerning 3 4 programs administered by the Administration for Native Americans ("ANA") under Title VIII of the Community Services Act, and the Papago Council does fully support such recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby recommends that:

- 1. Since the ANA has been unable to meet its diverse responsibilities to Indian tribal governments, urban Indian Centers and other Native American groups at the \$32 to \$33.8 million funding level that has prevailed over the last seven fiscal years, the Administration must seek a substantial increase in this funding level. The Appropriations Committees of both the House and Senate are urged to hold special hearings on the ANA budget, taking testimony from Indian governments and organizations. Acting on the basis of the need shown in these hearings, the Congress should approve a funding increase.
- The Papago Council voices serious concerns about the new ANA policy initiative called Social and Economic Development Strategies (SEDS). Indian Tribes and other affected groups must be consulted in the development of such a policy initiative. ANA should not implement SEDS by defunding existing grantees or reducing the funding levels for existing programs. ANA should not impose time limits on the continuation of its ongoing support for Indian Tribes and off-reservation groups, and ANA grants should continue in the light of the principle of self-determination rather than imposing federal agency ideas of program priorities on Tribes or other grantees. ANA should publish information on the distribution of all ANA funds by grantee and program type in order to indicate the source of the funds it is allocating to the SEDS approach.
- Since the authorization for ANA programs, Title VIII of the Community Services Act, expires at the end of Fiscal Year 1981, the Administration and the Congress should develop a plan to consult with Indian Tribes and organizations on the renewal of this Act and other administrative and policy issues.
- 4. Better communications be developed by ANA with the Indian tribal governments, certain Indian centers and other Native American groups.
