WHEREAS, the Sells Indian Hospital is equipped to care for 40 inpatients; and 1 WHEREAS, chronic and ongoing staffing problems resulting from low pay and grade 2 classifications have led to a lack of needed laboratory and X-Ray 3 technicians and Director of Nursing, to a low state of morale, and 4 to a decision on April 29, 1980 by all six staff physicians to refer 5 all patients needing inpatient care to off-reservation Indian Health 6 7 Service and non-Indian Health Service hospital facilities for care; and WHEREAS, this decision, requiring the closing of the Sells Indian Hospital to 8 9 inpatient care, was not made public until May 8, 1980, at which time the Papago Council ordered a hearing concerning the causes which led to 10 11 the decision to close the hospital to inpatient care; and WHEREAS, the Papago Council did find that there has been ongoing administrative 12 mismanagement, below grade staffing, inadequate salary levels, low 13 14 morale and chronic absenteeism resulting from inaction by the responsible 15 Department of Health and Human Services/Health Services Administration/ Public Health Service/Indian Health Service/Office of Research and 16 Development/Sells Indian Hospital agencies, which inaction jeopardizes 17 the health and well being of the Papago people, deprives the Papago 18 19 Tribe of Congressionally mandated health services and requires the 20 transportation of the sick as far as 150 miles away to secure emergency 21 inpatient services.

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it finds that the 23 conditions at the Sells Indian Hospital create an immediate condition 24 of health emergency; that all responsible officers of the Department 25 of Health and Human Services/Health Services Administration/Public 26 Health Service/Indian Health Service/Office of Research and Development/ 27 Sells Indian Hospital be requested to take necessary measures to im-28 mediately reinstate quality inpatient services at the hospital; that 29 Senator Dennis DeConcini and Congressman Morris K. Udall be advised 30 forthwith of this health emergency and be requested to investigate or 31 call for a congressional investigation into the administration of the 32 hospital; that Enos J. Francisco, Jr., Vice Chairman of the Papago

RES. NO. 35-80 Page 2 Council, with the help of the Executive Health Staff of the Papago Tribe do everything necessary to implement the purposes of this Resolution. The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on <u>8th</u> day of <u>May</u>, 1980, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>965</u> for; <u>0</u> against; <u>0</u> not voting; and <u>1</u> absent, purs of 965 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent, pursu to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (d) & (h) of Article V of absent, pursuant the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
