

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Support of the Scouting Program)

Resolution No. 43-80

1 WHEREAS, the young people of the Papago Tribe are the Tribe's greatest
2 resource; and

3 WHEREAS, the personal development and social growth of the young people are
4 the responsibility shared by the family and the Tribe; and

5 WHEREAS, the principles of character building, leadership, citizenship, and
6 cultural identify are principles that directly benefit young men
7 and women; and

8 WHEREAS, these are the principles upon which the Scouting program is founded;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, the Scouting programs affords our young men and women an opportunity
11 to participate in such principle-oriented activities and benefit
12 directly from them.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT,

- 14 1. The Papago Council, the official governing body of the Papago
15 Tribe, finds the Scouting program worthwhile and endorses the
16 program within the Papago Reservation.
- 17 2. The Papago Council recommends the support of the Scouting program
18 and that funds as are made available from time to time to be
19 used for that purpose.

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 3rd.
21 day of June, 1980, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, with a vote of
22 965 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to the
23 authority vested in the Council by Section II, (h) and (c) of Article V of the
24 Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago
25 Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on
26 January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
27 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior
28 and is effective as of the date of it's enactment by the Papago Council.
