

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 51-80

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council believes that the Papago Tribe would benefit  
2 substantially if the Council and key administrative staff could  
3 participate in a management training program dealing with basic  
4 law for tribal officials; and

5 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has funds available to provide tech-  
6 nical assistance to Indian tribes for such programs; and

7 WHEREAS, it is anticipated that it will cost approximately \$7,600.00 in order  
8 to provide such management training program for the Papago Council  
9 and key administrative staff.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby  
11 authorize and direct the Chairman or Vice Chairman of the Papago  
12 Council to negotiate, execute and modify technical assistance  
13 contracts and sub-contracts in a sum not to exceed \$7,600.00 to  
14 fund a management training program dealing with basic law for  
15 tribal officials with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, effective  
16 June 30 through September 30, 1980.

17 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 20th  
18 day of June, 1980, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
19 965.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent pursuant to  
20 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) and Section  
21 3 (a) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe  
22 of Arizona, as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and  
23 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to  
24 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is  
25 subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the  
26 date of enactment by the Papago Council.
