

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Supporting NCAI Recommendations - CETA)

RES. NO. 97-80

1 WHEREAS, the Papago CETA Programs have reported certain recommendations to the
2 Papago Council which were supported by the Human Resource Committee of
3 the National Congress of American Indians pertaining to Comprehensive
4 Employment and Training Act ("CETA") Programs of the Department of
5 Labor, and the Papago Tribal Council does also fully support such
6 recommendations.

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby recommends
8 that:

- 9 1. The Department of Labor ("DOL") should immediately withdraw its
10 proposed plan to reorganize the Division of Indian and Native
11 American Programs ("DINAP") since this plan was developed without
12 consultation with Tribal governments or other grantees and
13 flagrantly violates DOL's responsibility to provide necessary
14 services to Indian Tribes and other organizations implementing
15 Indian employment and training programs. Any organizational plan
16 affecting DINAP should be developed only after full, open
17 consultation with Tribes and other grantees, and must insure that
18 DINAPs have sufficient authority to administer Indian CETA programs,
19 including the power to set policy, make and monitor grants and
20 provide necessary technical assistance to grantees. DOL must
21 provide DINAPs with a staffing level adequate to meet their full
22 responsibilities to all grantees.
- 23 2. The Congress should act swiftly to extend authorizing legislation
24 for special Indian youth programs, protecting present funding
25 levels for such programs and insuring that the regulations for
26 Indian programs take into account the special circumstances of
27 Indian communities. Further, Congress and DOL should take
28 necessary steps to provide special discretionary funds to initiate
29 programs serving urban Indian youth whose needs are not currently
30 met from either the Indian set-aside or the funds channeled
31 through state and local government prime sponsors.
- 32 3. Congress should act swiftly to extend authorizing legislation for
Indian private sector programs under Title VII of CETA. DOL
should use additional Title VII funds, above the minimum 2% level
provided in the past, to meet more of the proven needs for this
program.
4. After appropriate consultation with Indian Tribes and other Indian
CETA grantees, DOL should clarify its policy with respect to the
audit of Indian programs. While providing increased accountability
in the audit process, by allowing grantees to contract for
necessary audit services, DOL must continue to provide special
funds for the conduct of audits since few, if any Indian CETA
grantees can afford to cover such costs out of their limited
allocations of funds they receive for administrative expenses.
5. The Congress and the Administration should, in consultation with
Indian Tribes and organizations, develop a procedure that assures
a full and fair examination of Indian needs and the success of
Indian programs in the process of writing a CETA renewal bill to
extend CETA payments past their scheduled September 30, 1982
expiration.


6. Department of Labor should develop administrative procedures and staffing to insure that all grantees receive new Fiscal Year funds within three weeks from the date of final enactment of the regular Department of Labor appropriations bill or continuing resolution covering CETA programs.
7. Department of Labor should fill the position of permanent Director of Indian Native American Programs at the earliest possible time.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th day of October, 1980, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 894. For; 0 Against; 71.0 Not Voting; and 1 Absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
