

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Hickiwan District - Well Maintenance)

RES. NO. 03-82

1 WHEREAS, the Hickiwan District has experienced serious problems with water
2 delivery and development, and by Resolution of its Council dated
3 November 07, 1981, requested the support of the Papago Council
4 in finding funds for water development in the District; and


5 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has very limited funds in its Well Maintenance
6 budget which are already over committed, and it will be necessary
7 to find outside sources for the additional funds; and

8 WHEREAS, the Papago Council finds that it is essential that needed water
9 delivery and development in the Hickiwan District, and the funds
10 necessary therefore, be provided as soon as possible.


11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Chairman and
12 Vice-Chairman of both the Papago and Hickiwan District Councils
13 coordinate their efforts and do all things possible to locate
14 funding sources and funds necessary to provide the Hickiwan District
15 with the needed water and water delivery systems, and they are
16 hereby authorized to execute any instruments on behalf of the
17 Papago Tribe necessary to receive grants or gifts of such funds.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th
19 day of January, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a
20 vote of 1148 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent,
21 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and
22 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona
23 as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
24 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
25 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
26 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its
27 enactment by the Papago Council.
