

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Intergovernmental Food Service Agreement)

RES. NO. 116-82

1 WHEREAS, the Child Care Food Program of the State of Arizona has funded
2 breakfast, lunch and snacks of the Papago Early Childhood Head
3 Start/Home Start by means of an Intergovernmental Food Service
4 Agreement between the Papago Tribe and the State of Arizona; and

5 WHEREAS, the Papago Early Childhood Head Start/Home Start has recommended
6 renewal of said agreement, effective October 1, 1982; and

7 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has reviewed the recommendation and supports
8 the Early Childhood Head Start/Home Start continuance of the
9 Child Care Food Program.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
11 approve the renewal of the application implementing the Child
12 Care Food Program from October 1, 1982 through September 30, 1983.

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman, Max H. Norris, is hereby
14 authorized to execute the Intergovernmental Food Service Agreement,
15 or any amendments thereto.


16 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 13th
17 day of September, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
18 of 1065.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 4 absent,
19 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and
20 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
21 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not
subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the
date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
