RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL (Appointment of Law and Order Committee)

RES. NO. 133-82

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council did by Resolution No. 77-71 establish a Committee for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations 2 to the Papago Council for revision of the Law and Order Code 3 and the laws of the Papago Tribe; and WHEREAS, the Papago Council did by Resolution No. 87-80 appoint members 4 of the Law and Order Committee to serve for a period of one 5 year or until replaced by the Papago Council; and 6 WHEREAS, the terms of the present Committee members have expired. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following members of the Papago 7 Tribe are hereby appointed as members of the Law and Order 8 Committee to serve for a period described herein: 9 Carmelita Mattias - three years 10 Francisco Jose, Jr. - three years 11 Dewey Ortega - two years Larry Martinez - two years 12 Sarah Corella - one year 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Law and Order Committee is hereby authorized 14 and directed as follows: 15 to adopt and recommend a Committee budget to the Papago Council: 16 (b) to adopt, formulate, and amend rules, regulations and guide-17 lines necessary to carry out its business; (c) to appoint a Committee chairperson and secretary, and such 18 other officers as may be appropriate; 19 to review the Law and Order Code and the Ordinances and Resolutions of the Papago Council constituting the civil 20 and criminal laws of the Papago Tribe, and their effects upon the Papago Tribe and its members, and upon the 21 Judicial Departments of the Papago Tribe, and to make recommendations to the Papago Council for revisions 22 and amendments of, or additions to the Law and Order Code and to existing Ordinances and Resolutions of the 23 Papago Council constituting the civil and criminal laws of the Papago Tribe; 24

(e) to assist the Judicial Departments of the Papago Tribe in the development of standards, rules and procedures within their respective jurisdictions for the effective administration of justice on the Papago Reservation;

- (f) to assist the Judicial Departments of the Papago Tribe and other tribal and governmental organizations and enterprises involved with the justice system on the Papago Reservation by supporting and assisting in the implementation and funding of innovative tribal justice programs;
- to interview applicants for the positions of judges and Department heads of the Judicial Departments of the Papago Tribe and to make recommendations, respectively, to the Papago Council and the Personnel Officer for appointments to such positions;

1 (h) to make recommendations and advise the Papago Council on all matters relating to the operation of the Judicial 2 Departments of the Papago Tribe. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee shall report to the Papago Council 3 not less than quarterly each year concerning its findings, work 4 and recommendations. The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 19th 5 day of October, 1982, at a meeting a which a quorum was present, pursuant to 6 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and Section 3 (b) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the 8 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
