

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Appointment of Law and Order Committee)

RES. NO. 133-82

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council did by Resolution No. 77-71 establish a
2 Committee for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations
3 to the Papago Council for revision of the Law and Order Code
and the laws of the Papago Tribe; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Council did by Resolution No. 87-80 appoint members
5 of the Law and Order Committee to serve for a period of one
year or until replaced by the Papago Council; and

6 WHEREAS, the terms of the present Committee members have expired, and

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following members of the Papago
8 Tribe are hereby appointed as members of the Law and Order
9 Committee to serve for a period described herein:

10 Carmelita Mattias - three years
11 Francisco Jose, Jr. - three years
12 Dewey Ortega - two years
13 Larry Martinez - two years
Sarah Corella - one year

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Law and Order Committee is hereby authorized
and directed as follows:

- 15 (a) to adopt and recommend a Committee budget to the Papago
16 Council;
- 17 (b) to adopt, formulate, and amend rules, regulations and guide-
lines necessary to carry out its business;
- 18 (c) to appoint a Committee chairperson and secretary, and such
other officers as may be appropriate;
- 19 (d) to review the Law and Order Code and the Ordinances and
20 Resolutions of the Papago Council constituting the civil
and criminal laws of the Papago Tribe, and their effects
21 upon the Papago Tribe and its members, and upon the
Judicial Departments of the Papago Tribe, and to make
22 recommendations to the Papago Council for revisions
and amendments of, or additions to the Law and Order
23 Code and to existing Ordinances and Resolutions of the
Papago Council constituting the civil and criminal laws
24 of the Papago Tribe;
- 25 (e) to assist the Judicial Departments of the Papago Tribe
in the development of standards, rules and procedures
26 within their respective jurisdictions for the effective
administration of justice on the Papago Reservation;
- 27 (f) to assist the Judicial Departments of the Papago Tribe
and other tribal and governmental organizations and
28 enterprises involved with the justice system on the
Papago Reservation by supporting and assisting in the
29 implementation and funding of innovative tribal justice
programs;
- 30 (g) to interview applicants for the positions of judges and
Department heads of the Judicial Departments of the
31 Papago Tribe and to make recommendations, respectively,
to the Papago Council and the Personnel Officer for
32 appointments to such positions;

1 (h) to make recommendations and advise the Papago Council
2 on all matters relating to the operation of the Judicial
3 Departments of the Papago Tribe.


4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee shall report to the Papago Council
5 not less than quarterly each year concerning its findings, work
6 and recommendations.

7 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 19th
8 day of October, 1982, at a meeting a which a quorum was present, pursuant to
9 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and Section 3 (b)
10 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
11 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the
12 Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the
13 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review
14 by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its
15 enactment by the Papago Council.
