## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL (Designating Projects and Programs Requiring) (Special Federal Appropriations )

RES. NO. 13-82

1	HEREAS, the Papago Council has heard testimony from its special ad hoc							
2	committee and from members of the Executive Health Staff identi-							
3	fying the most urgent needs of the Papago Tribe; and							
4	HEREAS, the Papago Council is mindful of the fact that in the present							
5	economic climate it will be difficult to obtain Federal funds							
6	and support to meet such needs; and							
7	WHEREAS, the Papago Council has placed special priority on the health needs							
8	of the Papago Tribe and has designated the following projects and							
9	programs as requiring immediate attention, namely, the construction							
10	of a Dialysis Satellite Center, a Nursing Home and a Children's							
11	Home, and the continued operation of the Papago Tribe's C.H.R.							
12	and Mental Health Programs.							
13	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby							
14	designate the foregoing projects and programs of the Papago Tribe							
15	as requiring immediate action, and does hereby authorize and direct							
16	the Chairman and other appropriate officers and agents of the Papago							
17	Council to submit testimony and evidence in support thereof, and							
18	of other projects and programs of the Papago Tribe requiring the							
19	attention and action of the United States Government, to Congress							
20	and the appropriate agencies and officers of the United States.							
21 22 23 24 25	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the <u>4th</u> day of February, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>1148.0</u> for; <u>0</u> against; <u>0</u> not voting; and <u>1</u> absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
