RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Objecting to OMB Circular A-76

RES. NO. 158-82

WHEREAS, the Papago Council has been informed that the Office of Management and Budget has ordered Phoenix Area Office of the Indian Health 2 Services to contract out for Food, Maintenance and Housekeeping 3 Services pursuant to Office of Management and Budget Circular 4 A-76; and WHEREAS, the express purpose of P. L. 93-638 is to strengthen Indian parti-5 cipation in programs and service conducted by the Federal 6 Government for the benefit of Indian people; and 7 WHEREAS, approximately 56 long term employees will be laid off if these departments are contracted out, 48 of which are Native Americans; and 8 WHEREAS, these employees have direct contact with patients from the served 9 Tribes, and are used to interpret and have dedicated their lives 10 and careers to serve Indian people; and WHEREAS, private contractors will not be required to follow Indian 11 preference; and 12 WHEREAS, the new employees will have to answer to the contractor and not to 13 Indian Health Service management. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council opposes the contracting 14 out of any services at the Phoenix Indian Medical Center, except 15 pursuant to P. L. 93-638. 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we request that the Office of Management and Budget Circular A-76 not be used to implement or supersede the pro-17 visions of P.L. 93-638 or the regulations enacted pursuant thereto. 18 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman and his designees are auth-19 orized to make the opposition of the Papago Council known to the Office of Management and Budget and to Congressional Delegates 20 concerning OMB Circular A-76 and its application to the Phoenix 21 Indian Medical Center. 22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 1st day of December, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote 23 0 against; 0 not voting; and for; pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and 24 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review 26 by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council. 27 THE PAPAGO COUNCIL 28
