

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Modification of Revenue Sharing)  
(for Special Learning Program )

RES. NO. 21-82

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Special Learning Program did on September 1, 1981, enter  
2 into an agreement with the Indian Oasis School District #40, to  
3 provide a special education program for 8 to 12 trainable mentally  
handicapped exceptional children funded by IHS funds; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has been advised that, because of federal budget  
5 cuts, no further IHS allocations would be received by the Tribe  
after February 17, 1982, to fund such program; and

6 WHEREAS, by Papago Council Resolutions 11-80, 93-80 and 17-81, a total of  
7 \$10,114.00 of 1980 Federal Revenue Sharing Funds were appropriated  
8 to the Special Learning Program to purchase a van; and


9 WHEREAS, the Program purchased such van and \$1,964.00 of such appropriated  
10 funds remain unexpended and available to the Special Learning  
Program; and

11 WHEREAS, the Program and the Indian Oasis School District #40 propose to  
12 utilize such unused Revenue Sharing Funds in the operation of a  
13 modified program for trainable mentally handicapped exceptional  
14 children pursuant to the attached Revised Budget (March 1, 1982 -  
15 June 30, 1982) in the amount of \$1,964.00 in lieu and in satis-  
faction of the respective obligations of both parties under the  
contract dated September 1, 1981.


16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby  
17 approve the use of \$1,964.00 of presently unused 1980 Federal  
18 Revenue Sharing Funds previously appropriated to the Papago  
19 Special Learning Program for the benefit of trainable mentally  
20 handicapped exceptional children in accordance with the attached  
budget.

21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 9th  
22 day of March, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
23 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent,  
24 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of  
25 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as  
amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by  
the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of  
the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to  
review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of  
its enactment by the Papago Council.
