

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Papago Early Childhood Education Program-IMPL Account)

RES. NO. 26-82

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has heard testimony from the Papago Education
2 Department concerning the failure of the Bureau of Indian Affairs
3 to fund the Papago Early Childhood Education program as mandated
4 by Congress; and
5 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has also heard testimony concerning a proposed
6 use of Papago Agency IMPL funds to fund the program; and
7 WHEREAS, there is a conflict between the Papago Tribe and the Bureau about
8 their claims to the funds in the Agency's IMPL account; and
9 WHEREAS, the Papago Council believes that the Bureau has a Congressionally
10 mandated obligation to fund the program and to account to the
11 Tribe for funds on special deposits, and interest thereon, in
12 the Agency's IMPL account.


13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
14 request an immediate accounting of funds in the Agency's IMPL
15 account belonging to the Tribe, and does hereby direct that no
16 tribal funds in the IMPL account shall be used by the Bureau
17 without the express authorization of this Council.

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the issue of funding the
19 Papago Early Childhood Education program shall be kept separate
20 from and independent of the issue of ownership of the funds in
21 the IMPL Agency account.


22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Early Childhood Education program
23 is hereby authorized to use the funds appropriated pursuant to
24 Ordinance No. 01-82 in order to continue the program pending
25 resolution of the Bureau's obligation to provide the funds
26 necessary to the program.

27 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th
28 day of March, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
29 741.5 for; 61.5 against; 345.0 not voting; and 2 absent,
30 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (c),
31 (e) and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe
32 of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as
of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
