

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
Housing Improvement Program FY 1982

RES. NO. 75-82

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Government established the Papago Skill Center
2 by Resolution No. 04-79, and the O'odham Construction by Resolution
3 No. 58-80, both are 100% tribally owned and operated; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Skill Center has trained 60 Papagos in construction
5 trades since the Center opened in August, 1981, and proposed to
6 place its construction trades graduates with the O'odham
7 Construction; and


8 WHEREAS, the Papago Skill Center has constructed (4) model homes with the
9 floor plans and construction techniques that are acceptable to
10 the Union and the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it does hereby authorize the Papago
12 Tribe to enter into a Contract for new housing under category
13 (d) of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Housing Program pursuant to
14 CFR 261.3 and 261.6(c) to build ten (10) homes in 1982. The
15 Bureau of Indian Affairs presently has \$307,000.00 available for
16 this purpose. Contract term to begin July 01, 1982 through the
17 end of fiscal year.


18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Max H. Norris, Enos J. Francisco, Jr., and/or
19 Rosita N. Ruiz, respectively the Chairman, Vice Chairman and
20 Treasurer of the Papago Council, are hereby authorized to
21 negotiate and execute the contract and any amendments thereto
22 on behalf of the Papago Tribe.

23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 18th
24 day of June, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
25 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent,
26 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d)
27 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
28 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
29 Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
30 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
31 the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment
32 by the Papago Council.
