

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
Housing Improvement Program FY 1983

RES. NO. 76-82

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Government established the Papago Skill Center
2 by Resolution No. 04-79, and the O'odham Construction by Resolution
3 No. 58-80, both are 100% tribally owned and operated; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Skill Center has trained 60 Papagos in construction
5 trades since the Center opened in August, 1981, and proposed to
6 plact its construction trades graduates with the O'odham
7 Construction; and

8 WHEREAS, the Papago Skill Center has constructed (4) model homes with the
9 floor plans and construction techniques that are acceptable to
10 the Union and the Bureau of Indian Affairs.


11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it does hereby authorize the Papago
12 Tribe to enter into a multi-year contract with the Bureau of
13 Indian Affairs pursuant to CFR 261.3 and 261.6(c) for the Housing
14 Improvement Program (HIP). Contract term to begin October 01,
15 1982 through September 30, 1985. The amount available for FY-83
16 is \$336,200.00.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the eligibility criteria will be as follows:
18 each District shall select one (1) participant and (1) alternate
19 pursuant to CFR 26.5 eligibility.


20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Max H. Norris, Chairman, Enos J. Francisco, Jr.,
21 Vice Chairman and/or Rosita N. Ruiz, Treasurer of the Papago
22 Council are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract
23 and any amendments thereto on behalf of the Papago Tribe.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 18th
25 day of June, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
26 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent,
27 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d)
28 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
29 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
30 Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
31 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
32 the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment
by the Papago Council.
