Make recommendations to the Chief of Police, with copies 3 to the Tribal Chairman and the Tribal Council, on all matters relating to, and affecting law enforcement and 4 public safety; 5 Develop and recommend law enforcement budgets to the 3. Tribal Council; 6 Make inquiries to determine whether the terms of the Law 4. Enforcement Contract are being adhered to and what 7 objectives have or have not been satisified; 8 Prescribe minimum standards and qualifications for police 5. officers, which shall be related to physical, mental and 9 moral fitness and shall govern the recruitment, appointment and retention of all police officers. The standards and qualifications shall be reviewed periodically and 10 may be amended at any time; 11 Prescribe minimum courses for training and minimum 6. standards for training facilities; 12 Recommend curricula for advanced courses and seminars in 7. 13 law enforcement at Universities, colleges and junior colleges in cooperation with the governing body of the educational institutions; 14 Establish a special fund for the training of police 8. 15 officers. All monies deposited in the fund shall be used exclusively for the costs of training and expenses 16 for the administration of the Commission; 17 9. Exercise its authorized powers in the best interests of the Papago Tribe within the limits of responsible judge-18 ment and shall not enter into contract or agreements in excess of the authority herein delegated to the Commission. 19 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th 20 day of August, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 3 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) of 21 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as 22 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of 23 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
