

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Papago Police Commission


RES. NO. 91-82

- 1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has proposed to take over all law and order
2 functions currently being administered and controlled by the
3 Bureau of Indian Affairs; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has found no declination issues
5 and the application for contract of Law Enforcement will
6 probably be approved; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the contract for Law Enforcement submitted by the Papago Tribe
8 calls for a Police Commission which will supervise and monitor
9 the administration of contract objectives, as well as monitor
10 the activities of the Chief of Police and of all personnel
11 working in law enforcement; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe will recruit and hire a Chief of Police by July
13 16, 1982, to begin to familiarize himself/herself with the
14 contract objectives; and
- 15 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Tribe that there be an orderly
16 and efficient transition and that the Police Commission be
17 established to monitor such transition and take-over of law
18 enforcement by the Tribe.
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that a Police Commission of five members be
20 established and that the Chairman of the Papago Tribe shall
21 select and appoint the commissioners in accordance with the
22 following provisions:
- 23 1. The Chairman shall appoint the members of the Police
24 Commission who shall be persons qualified by experience
25 or education in law enforcement.
 - 26 2. The Chairman shall appoint the Chairman of the Police
27 Commission from among the members at the first meeting,
28 and every year thereafter a new chairman will be appointed.
29 Meetings shall be held at least quarterly or upon the
30 request of the Commission Chairman or by request of three
31 (3) members of the Commission or by the Tribal Chairman.
32 A vacancy shall occur when a member is absent without the
permission of the Commission Chairman for three (3)
consecutive meetings. The Tribal Chairman may remove a
member for cause.
 3. The terms of two (2) of the members initially appointed
shall be for three years and the terms of three (3) of
the members initially appointed shall be for two (2)
years. The terms of all members appointed thereafter
shall be for two (2) years and staggered.
 4. Compensation shall be paid at the same rate as that
established for other committees and boards.
 5. Membership of the Police Commission shall not constitute
the holding of a public office, and members shall not be
required to take an oath of office. No member of the
Commission shall be disqualified from holding any public
office or employment.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Police Commission shall have the powers and
duty to:


- 1 1. Develop, adopt, amend and rescind rules, regulations and
2 guidelines reasonably necessary to carry out the duties
of the Commission; and
- 3 2. Make recommendations to the Chief of Police, with copies
4 to the Tribal Chairman and the Tribal Council, on all
matters relating to, and affecting law enforcement and
public safety;
- 5 3. Develop and recommend law enforcement budgets to the
6 Tribal Council;
- 7 4. Make inquiries to determine whether the terms of the Law
8 Enforcement Contract are being adhered to and what
9 objectives have or have not been satisfied;
- 10 5. Prescribe minimum standards and qualifications for police
11 officers, which shall be related to physical, mental and
12 moral fitness and shall govern the recruitment, appoint-
13 ment and retention of all police officers. The standards
14 and qualifications shall be reviewed periodically and
may be amended at any time;
- 15 6. Prescribe minimum courses for training and minimum
16 standards for training facilities;
- 17 7. Recommend curricula for advanced courses and seminars in
18 law enforcement at Universities, colleges and junior
colleges in cooperation with the governing body of the
educational institutions;
- 19 8. Establish a special fund for the training of police
officers. All monies deposited in the fund shall be
used exclusively for the costs of training and expenses
for the administration of the Commission;
- 20 9. Exercise its authorized powers in the best interests of
the Papago Tribe within the limits of responsible judge-
ment and shall not enter into contract or agreements in
excess of the authority herein delegated to the Commission.

21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
22 day of August, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
23 of 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 3 absent,
24 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) of
Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
its enactment by the Papago Council.
