8	approve of the attached form letter to be sent to persons
9	delinquent in their payments to the Papago Housing Authority
10	and who are employees of the Papago Tribe and does hereby direct
11	the Chairman of the Papago Council to sign the letter for use
12	by the Authority.
13	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th day of August, 1982, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
14	of 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and
15	(f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
16	the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review
17	by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
