1	WHEREAS,	the expansion of non-Indian communities and industries bordering
2		the San Xavier Reservation has resulted in serious non-Indian motor
3		vehicle traffic, ground water depletion, air pollution, wanton
		trash dumping, illegal trespass and other adverse actions that are
4		now having a serious impact on the living conditions of members of
5	WHEREAS	the Papago Tribe living within the San Xavier District; and the non-Indians are using the San Xavier Road as a shortcut from
6	, minutes,	and to I-10 from areas west and east of the San Xavier Reservation;
7		and
8	WHEREAS,	San Xavier Road runs directly in front of the San Xavier Mission,
		Mission School and the community center, and said traffic creates
9		a health and safety hazard for the Papago children, adults, invited
10		guests and visitors to the San Xavier Mission; and
11	WHEREAS,	a recent close encounter of a non-Indian gravel truck and a Papago
12		school bus could have resulted in serious injuries or death of Papago children; and
13	WHEREAS,	future non-Indian growth within the area will not abate but will
14		continue to increase which will multiply the already existing
		serious problems; and
15	WHEREAS,	alternate routes are available for the traffic that normally uses
16		this BIA road for travel through the San Xavier Reservation; and
17	WHEREAS,	25 C.F.R. 162.8 requires free public use on BIA roads constructed
18		and maintained with federal funds, with the exception that if
		required for public safety the commissioner may restrict the use of BIA roads or may close them to public use; and
19	WHEREAS	the Papago Tribal Council and the San Xavier District Council have
20	,	the responsibility to provide for the health, safety and welfare
21		of the Papago children, adults, invited guests and visitors to the
22		San Xavier Mission.
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the appropriat	
		officials of the Bureau of Indian Affairs take affirmative steps to
24		restrict the traffic on the San Xavier Road to community members,
25		visitors to the San Xavier Mission, school buses, city transit buses,
26		United States Postal Services, emergency vehicles and vehicles for
27		religious services, or close that portion of the San Xavier Road as is necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the Papago
28		children, the elderly and other adults, their invited guests and
		visitors to the San Xavier Mission.
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appropriate BIA officials study all alternate	
30		roads for traffic now using the San Xavier Road and the feasibility
31		of restricting said traffic to these alternate roads.
