RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Fire Protection

RES. NO. 04-84

WHEREAS, the San Lucy District Council has voiced its concern about the lack of fire protection available to the District and its residents, and has requested the aid of the Papago Council and the Bureau of Indian Affairs to develop means of providing and/or financing the cost of fire protection for the San Lucy District; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council finds that no adequate fire protection program or services are available on the Papago Reservation and that it is of primary importance to the Papago Tribe that a Reservation-wide study be made which will recommend means of providing and/or financing the cost of fire protection for each part of the Reservation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby request the appropriate officials of the Papago Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs to schedule meetings with officials of the various Districts in order to develop recommendations or programs which will provide and/or finance fire protection for all of the Districts and areas of the Papago Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the day of January, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1258.0 for; 107.0 against; 75.0 not voting; and 3 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (e) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
