## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

## (Law Enforcement)

1	WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has contracted for law enforcement services since	
2	1982 from the Bureau of Indian Affairs pursuant to 93-638; and	
3	WHEREAS, the overall objective of the law enforcement program is a commitment	
	by the Papago Tribe to provide the most responsive and effective being	
4	police service possible to all districts and areas of the Papago	
5	reservation; and	
6	WHEREAS, deployment of police officers is based on the amount of criminal	
7	activity taking place within districts; and	
8	WHEREAS, every district requires and requests more police patrol than can be provided considering present funding and manpower limitations, and	
	WHEREAS, the Papago Council has reviewed the existing law enforcement base	
9	allocation and finds that additional funds must be appropriated to	
10	enable the law enforcement program to response to growing law	
11	enforcement needs; and	
12	WHEREAS, the Papago Council believes that an increase in the base allocation	
13	for law enforcement program can be justified and supported by data and	1
14	information; and	
-	WHEREAS, the operation of the law enforcement program has been successful and beneficial to the Papago Tribe and its people despite the funding	
15	limitations; and	
16	WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe desires to recontract for continuation of law	
17	enforcement services and programs during FY 85; and	
18	WHEREAS, 25 CFR 271.20 of the Federal Regulations requires that all proposals	
19	to recontract be submitted to the Tribal Council for approval at	
	least 120 days prior to the contract terminations;	
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does authorize and requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract with the Papago	
21	Tribe pursuant to P.L. 93-638 and its regulations and procedures	
22	codified in 25 CFR 271 for provision of law enforcement services.	
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is directed to seek	
24	and fund the law enforcement program at the level reflected in the	
25	attached budget and that the provisions of 25 CFR 271.20 requiring	
	the Superintendent to propose alternative funding sources if he	
26	determines that funds from non-contracted or parts of programs at the	
27	Agency level cannot be reduced to fund the law enforcement program, be followed, and that no reductions be made in contracted programs	
28	currently being administered by the Papago Tribe.	
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of the law enforcement contract shall	
30	be from October 1, 1984 through September 30. 1985.	
31	BE IT FURHTER RESOLVED that the Papago Tribe will not fund or operate the law	
	enforcement program for which a contract is requested herewith	
32	which has not been negotiated and executed by the Bureau of Indian	
	Affairs prior to the start of the funding year.	

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Jr., Vice Chariman or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute these contracts

and any amendments thereto for the duration of the contracts.

4 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 22nd day of May, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 5 1440.0 for; -O- against; -O- not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d), and (m) of 6 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by 7 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to 8 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council. 9
