

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Law Enforcement)



1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has contracted for law enforcement services since
2 1982 from the Bureau of Indian Affairs pursuant to 93-638; and
3 WHEREAS, the overall objective of the law enforcement program is a commitment
4 by the Papago Tribe to provide the most responsive and effective
5 police service possible to all districts and areas of the Papago
6 reservation; and
7 WHEREAS, deployment of police officers is based on the amount of criminal
8 activity taking place within districts; and
9 WHEREAS, every district requires and requests more police patrol than can be
10 provided considering present funding and manpower limitations, and
11 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has reviewed the existing law enforcement base
12 allocation and finds that additional funds must be appropriated to
13 enable the law enforcement program to response to growing law
14 enforcement needs; and
15 WHEREAS, the Papago Council believes that an increase in the base allocation
16 for law enforcement program can be justified and supported by data and
17 information; and
18 WHEREAS, the operation of the law enforcement program has been successful and
19 beneficial to the Papago Tribe and its people despite the funding
20 limitations; and
21 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe desires to recontract for continuation of law
22 enforcement services and programs during FY 85; and
23 WHEREAS, 25 CFR 271.20 of the Federal Regulations requires that all proposals
24 to recontract be submitted to the Tribal Council for approval at
25 least 120 days prior to the contract terminations;
26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does authorize
27 and requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract with the Papago
28 Tribe pursuant to P.L. 93-638 and its regulations and procedures
29 codified in 25 CFR 271 for provision of law enforcement services.
30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is directed to seek
31 and fund the law enforcement program at the level reflected in the
32 attached budget and that the provisions of 25 CFR 271.20 requiring
the Superintendent to propose alternative funding sources if he
determines that funds from non-contracted or parts of programs at the
Agency level cannot be reduced to fund the law enforcement program,
be followed, and that no reductions be made in contracted programs
currently being administered by the Papago Tribe.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of the law enforcement contract shall
be from October 1, 1984 through September 30, 1985.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Tribe will not fund or operate the law
enforcement program for which a contract is requested herewith
which has not been negotiated and executed by the Bureau of Indian
Affairs prior to the start of the funding year.


1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Jr.,
2 Vice Chariman or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council
3 is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute these contracts
4 and any amendments thereto for the duration of the contracts.

5 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 22nd
6 day of May, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
7 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to the
8 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d), and (m) of
9 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
10 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
11 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the
12 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
13 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
14 its enactment by the Papago Council.
