RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Air Force Flight Operations

1	WHEREAS, despite previous agreements with Representatives of the United
2	States Air Force regarding flight operations overlying the Sells
	Papago Indian Reservation, the United States Air Force has
3	continuously violated this agreement to the detriment of the
4	Papago people; and
5	WHEREAS, each violation has become more and more serious and on Saturday,
6	December 10, 1983, at approximately 9:30 A.M., three United
	States super sonic aircraft flying west to east at near ground
7	level at speeds sufficient to create sonic booms of such magni-
8	tude that homes, personal property, and a church located at the Village of Vaya Chin were severely damages; and
9	WHEREAS, individuals residing in the Village of Vaya Chin were injured,
10	both psychologically and physically due to the seriousness of
	the low flying aircraft and the sonic booms; and
11	WHEREAS, in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act, a
12	draft of an Environmental Impact Statement was prepared in
13	1979, and at the present time is being circulated for final
14	comments; and
	WHEREAS, the well being and preservation of the Papago people, their
15	children, homes, churches, livestock and Papago governmental
16	buildings dictate that this Council take any and all affirma-
17	tive action to terminate this type of detrimental flight
18	operations overlying the Sells Papago Indian Reservation.
	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Council does hereby authorize
19	and instruct the Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and all
20	other necessary Tribal officials, attorneys, and advisors to
21	take all action necessary to terminate the detrimental flight operations by the United States Air Force overlying the Sells
22	Papago Indian Reservation.
	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the <u>5th</u>
23	day of January, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
24	of <u>1440.0</u> for; <u>0</u> against; <u>0</u> not voting; and <u>0</u> absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (h) and
25	(m) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
26	the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the
	Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its
27	enactment by the Papago Council.
