
WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has operated successfully a Headstart, Early Childhood and Day Care program for its young members; and
WHEREAS, Funding for the operation of these programs has depended in large on meritorious proposals by the Papago Tribe to various funding agencies designed to fund programs oriented toward children; and
WHEREAS, The Department of Economic Security through the Administration for Children, Youth and Families provides funds for certain eligible services; and
WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe is desirous of seeking supplemental funds from the Department of Economic Security to continue operation of its day care programs;
WHEREAS, All of the child-oriented programs have proven beneficial and valuable to the Papago Tribe and its people, especially its young members;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby approve the proposal to the Department of Economic Security, Administration for Children, Youth and Families for funding in the form of reimbursement for the continued operation of the day care services program;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Vice Chairman or Rosita N. Ruiz, Treasurer hereby authorized and directed to negotiate and execute any and all contracts, amendments and documents necessary to secure funding from the Administration for Children, Youth and Families;

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 21st day of June, 19 84, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
