


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Papago Food Distribution & Family Nutrition Services

Res. No. 135-84


1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has operated successfully a program whereby the
2 diet and nutritional needs of eligible Papago people have been
3 served by supplementing other federal social service programs; and
4 WHEREAS, The funding for the Papago Food Distribution/Family Nutrition
5 Services has been provided through the United States Department of
6 Agriculture; and
7 WHEREAS, The continued operation of the food distribution program is essential
8 to provide basic diet and nutrition for eligible clients; and
9 WHEREAS, A proposal for continued funding of the food distribution program
10 has been prepared by the Food Distribution program and is in accord-
11 ance with funding guidelines of USDA:
12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby approves
13 the application for continued funding of the Papago Food Distribution/
14 Family Nutrition Services from the U.S. Department of Agriculture; and
15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Josiah Moore, Chairman,
16 Francisco Jose, Jr, Vice-Chairman or Rosita N. Ruiz, Treasurer, are
17 hereby authorized to apply for, and negotiate and execute any and
18 all contracts, amendments and other documents necessary to secure
19 funding for the continued operation of the Papago Food Distribution
20 program.
21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th
22 day of July, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
23 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -1- absent, pursuant to
24 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article
25 V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
26 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
27 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
28 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
29 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
30 the Papago Council.
