

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

CONTRACT FOR JAIL RENOVATION PROJECT


- 1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe, has since learning of the Emergency Jobs appropria-  
2 tion for renovation of jails, advised the Bureau of Indian Affairs of  
3 its intent to contract for all aspects of the renovation as evidenced  
4 by Resolution No. 79-83; 160-83; and 161-83; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has since the Papago Council's initial  
6 resolution in June, 1983, failed to provide the Papago Tribe with  
7 the necessary technical assistance to prepare the contract document  
8 required to contract for the jail renovation project; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has consistently since June, 1983 provided informa-  
10 tion and documents to the Bureau of Indian Affairs at the Bureau's  
11 request to begin the process of contracting pursuant to P.L. 93-638  
12 and its regulations; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe was advised by the Contracting Officer for the  
14 jail renovation projects in November, 1983, that construction projects  
15 are not "contractible" programs under 25 CFR 271.12 (5) unless a  
16 waiver is requested by the Tribe and granted by the Assistant Secretary  
17 of Indian Affairs; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe upon learning of this provision sought to have a  
19 waiver considered and granted by the Assistant Secretary and has  
20 recieved no response; and
- 21 WHEREAS, the latest communication from the Contracting Officer for the jail  
22 renovation project states that the Papago Tribe must submit a contract  
23 application and resolution for the construction phase of the  
24 renovation project; and
- 25 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has the ability and capacity to undertake and  
26 perform the necessary repairs and renovation to the existing facility;  
27 and
- 28 WHEREAS, the project would generate "labor intensive" employment for unemployed  
29 and eligible members and non-member residents of the Papago Reserva-  
30 tion; and
- 31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby authorizes  
32 and directs the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract with the Papago  
Tribe pursuant to P.L. 93-638 and its regulations for the construction  
phase of the jail renovation project;
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby requests a waiver  
of 25 CFR 271.12 (5) pursuant to the authority of 25 CFR 1.2 and  
271.21 (b) and requests the Contracting Officer to transmit the  
request to the Assistant Secretary for prompt response in accordance  
with 25 CFR 271.15 (b), (1); and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Josiah Moore, Chairman;  
Francisco Jose, Jr., Vice-Chairman or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, are  
hereby authorized and directed to apply for, negotiate, and execute

1 all contracts, and any amendments thereto and all other necessary  
2 documents to secure a contract for the construction phase of the  
3 jail renovation projects authorized by P.L. 98-8, Emergency Jobs  
Bill;

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of this contract shall begin upon  
5 awarding of the contract and will terminate upon completion of the  
6 renovation project.

7 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th  
8 day of July, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
9 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to  
10 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article  
11 V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,  
ratified by the Papago Tribe on December, 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary  
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June  
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the  
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by  
the Papago Council.
