

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Direct Federal funding for WIC Papago Nutrition Program


1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has provided preventive health care for women,
2 infants and children during fiscal year 84; and
3 WHEREAS, Bureau of Nutrition Services, Arizona Department of Health
4 Services receives funds from the United States Department of
5 Agriculture for programs designed to benefit women, infants and
6 children; and
7 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe, by and through its Nutrition Improvement program
8 has contracted with the Bureau of Nutrition Services for funds to
9 operate and fund its women, infants and children (WIC) program; and
10 WHEREAS, The services provided to eligible clients has been beneficial and
11 services continue to be necessary to help alleviate nutritional
12 health risks and improve the health of individuals at risk; and
13 WHEREAS, The Papago Nutrition Improvement program has prepared an application
14 for funding in Fiscal year 85;

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby approves
16 the application for funding from the Arizona Department of Health
17 Services, Bureau of Nutrition Services to continue to operate and
18 provide services to eligible women, infants and children; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Josiah Moore, Chairman
20 Francisco Jose, Jr. Vice-Chairman or Rosita N. Ruiz, Treasurer, are
21 hereby authorized to apply for, and negotiate and execute any and
22 all contracts, amendments and other documents necessary to secure
23 funding for the WIC program under the Papago Nutrition Improvement
24 program.

25 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th
26 day of July, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
27 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -1- absent, pursuant to
28 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article
29 V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
30 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December, 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
31 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
32 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
