


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
JTPA InterGovernmental Agreement


1 WHEREAS, the Job Training Partnership Act was enacted into law in 1982
2 replacing the Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA); and
3 WHEREAS, funding is made available to state and tribal governments to
4 establish programs for improving the employment prospects of
5 eligible persons through the designation of service delivery
6 areas; and
7 WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has received an allotment of JTPA funds
8 to develop a network of employment training programs through-
9 out the State; and
10 WHEREAS, the Indian Reservations in Arizona have been designated as
11 service delivery areas and are eligible to receive State JTPA
12 funds; and
13 WHEREAS, the Papago JTPA office has applied for State JTPA funds but
14 must enter into an InterGovernmental Agreement with the
15 State of Arizona; and
16 WHEREAS, representatives of the Papago Tribe and the State of Arizona,
17 Department of Economic Security have engaged in negotiations
18 and have approved an agreement.
19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the attached
20 InterGovernmental Agreement between the Papago Tribe and the
21 State of Arizona, Department of Economic Security is hereby
22 approved.
23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman or other tribal officials are
24 hereby authorized to sign and execute the InterGovernmental
25 Agreement on behalf of the Papago Tribe.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
27 day of January, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
28 of 1386.5 for; 53.5 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent,
29 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (e)
30 and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
31 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
32 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as
of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
