	WHEREAS, historically from time immemorial, the Sand Papagos lived on and
1	the western part of the Papagueria, between the western boundaries
	of the domain of the Papago Pueblos and the Colorado River; and
2	WHEREAS, historically, the Sand Papagos were the only users of this region
3	and for many years inhabited and farmed in this area, including
4	establishing and maintaining cemeteries for deceased members; and
5	WHEREAS, prior to and during the early 1900's their traditional homeland
6	was, for the most part, taken over by non-Indians utilizing
	various means of eviction and in 1957 the final area occupied by
7	Sand Papagos was taken over by the U.S. Government and added to the Organ Pipe National Monument acreage; and
8	WHEREAS, many Sand Papagos do not meet the Papago Constitutional requirements
9	to qualify for membership in the Papago Tribe; and
10	WHEREAS, without proper funding, it is difficult to determine the exact number
	of San Papagos still living but it has been estimated that in
11	excess of five hundred Sand Papagos are living without any homeland;
12	and
13	WHEREAS, the Sand Papagos have requested the San Lucy District of the Papago
14	Tribe and the Papago Tribe to assist them, financially and use of
	the Tribe's expertise, in their endeavor to acquire by Federal
15	legislation acres of federal land located just west of the
16	Sells Papago Reservation abutting the boundaries of Gu Vo District
17	and Hickiwan District, and in addition thereto the land located in the Darby Wells area which for many years has been used and is still
18	being utilized by the Sand Papagos as a cemetery, a map and legal
19	description is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and
	WHEREAS, the Sand Papagos are requesting that his proposed Federal
20	legislation contain a provision that would describe this area of
21	land as part of the Sells Papago Reservation and legally considered
22	as the twelfth district of the Papago Tribe; and
23	WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the Papago Tribe to assist, both
24	financially and through use of the Tribe's expertise, the San
	Papagos in their endeavor to acquire a homeland.
25	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the Papago Tribe assist the Sand Papagos in their endeavor to acquire by
26	Federal legislation the acres of Federal land to be used as the homeland of the Sand Papagos, and in addition thereto that
27	certain area near Darby Wells now being used as a cemetery, and
28	further consent to this area being legislatively described as the new twelfth district of the Papago Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the day of February, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1163.5 for; 172.5 against; 104.0 not voting; and absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a), (h) and (m) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council
