

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Sand Papago - Legislation)

RES. NO. 16-84

1 WHEREAS, historically from time immemorial, the Sand Papagos lived on and
2 the western part of the Papagueria, between the western boundaries
3 of the domain of the Papago Pueblos and the Colorado River; and

4 WHEREAS, historically, the Sand Papagos were the only users of this region
5 and for many years inhabited and farmed in this area, including
6 establishing and maintaining cemeteries for deceased members; and

7 WHEREAS, prior to and during the early 1900's their traditional homeland
8 was, for the most part, taken over by non-Indians utilizing
9 various means of eviction and in 1957 the final area occupied by
10 Sand Papagos was taken over by the U.S. Government and added to
11 the Organ Pipe National Monument acreage; and

12 WHEREAS, many Sand Papagos do not meet the Papago Constitutional requirements
13 to qualify for membership in the Papago Tribe; and

14 WHEREAS, without proper funding, it is difficult to determine the exact number
15 of San Papagos still living but it has been estimated that in
16 excess of five hundred Sand Papagos are living without any homeland;
17 and

18 WHEREAS, the Sand Papagos have requested the San Lucy District of the Papago
19 Tribe and the Papago Tribe to assist them, financially and use of
20 the Tribe's expertise, in their endeavor to acquire by Federal
21 legislation _____ acres of federal land located just west of the
22 Sells Papago Reservation abutting the boundaries of Gu Vo District
23 and Hicciwan District, and in addition thereto the land located in
24 the Darby Wells area which for many years has been used and is still
25 being utilized by the Sand Papagos as a cemetery, a map and legal
26 description is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

27 WHEREAS, the Sand Papagos are requesting that his proposed Federal
28 legislation contain a provision that would describe this area of
29 land as part of the Sells Papago Reservation and legally considered
30 as the twelfth district of the Papago Tribe; and


31 WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the Papago Tribe to assist, both
32 financially and through use of the Tribe's expertise, the San
Papagos in their endeavor to acquire a homeland.

33 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the Papago
34 Tribe assist the Sand Papagos in their endeavor to acquire by
35 Federal legislation the _____ acres of Federal land to be used
36 as the homeland of the Sand Papagos, and in addition thereto that
37 certain area near Darby Wells now being used as a cemetery, and
38 further consent to this area being legislatively described as the
39 new twelfth district of the Papago Tribe.


40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is hereby authorized to use and
41 and all of the Tribal expertise to initiate and process this
42 legislation and upon presentation of a proper budget this Council
43 will consider the amount of financial support the Papago Tribe will
44 authorize for cost and expenses over and above the use of the Tribe
45 expertise.

1 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th
2 day of February, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a
3 vote of 1163.5 for; 172.5 against; 104.0 not voting; and
4 0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by
5 Section 2 (a), (h) and (m) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws
6 of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12,
7 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937,
8 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said
9 Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is
10 effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council
