16			tions of this Resolution and applicable tribal laws, codes, regu- lations and customs of the Papago Tribe.

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The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 9th day of August, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1258.0 for; 75.0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) (m) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
