


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
United Way Funding for Thohono O'odham Youth Services


Res No 173-84

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has seen the importance of providing services to  
2 its youth; and  
3 WHEREAS, The Thohono O'odham Youth Services (TOYS) office was established by  
4 the Papago Council to provide certain services to youth in several  
5 areas; and  
6 WHEREAS, The Papago Council did by Resolution No. 125-83 provide and direct  
7 the Chairman to work with the TOYS office to help it to secure the  
8 necessary financial support to continue its operations and services;  
9 and  
10 WHEREAS, The TOYS office responded to a request for proposals (REP) sent out  
11 by the United Way of Tucson to fund certain eligible programs among  
12 them youth related activities; and  
13 WHEREAS, United Way has advised the TOYS office that the proposal has received  
14 favorable review and will be funded upon the signing of an agreement;  
15 and  
16 WHEREAS, The funds will benefit the TOYS office and youth participating in the  
17 proposed program; and  
18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it authorizes  
19 Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Vice-Chairman or Rosita  
20 Ruiz, Treasurer to negotiate and execute any agreements, contracts  
21 and amendments, and any other documents necessary to secure the  
22 funding from United Way for use by the Thohono O'odham Youth Services  
23 office in accordance with its goals and objectives developed in its  
24 proposal to United Way.  
25 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 9th day  
26 of August, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
27 1333.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the  
28 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (f) of Article V  
29 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,  
30 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Sec-  
31 retary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act  
32 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by  
the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment  
by the Papago Council.
