


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
Presiding Judge Job Announcement

Res. No. 181-84

1 WHEREAS, Section 2 of Chapter I of the Law and Order Code of the Papago Tribe
2 provides that the Papago Tribal Courts shall consist of two (2)
3 regular Judges, and that such Judges "shall be appointed by the
4 Commissioner of Indian Affairs, subject to confirmation by a majority
5 vote of the Papago Council", for a term of two (2) years; and
6 WHEREAS, The Law and Order Committee has proposed that the Presiding Judge be
7 under the general supervision of the Chairman of the Papago Tribe; and
8 WHEREAS, The practice has been to place supervision of the Presiding Judge
9 under the auspices of the Chief Judge; and
10 WHEREAS, This practice has been beneficial towards the guidance and enhance-
11 ment of the Presiding Judge's effectiveness and there appears to be
12 no practical reason to change the arrangement; and
13 WHEREAS, The salary budgeted for the Presiding Judge position should be
14 established on such a basis as to compensate qualified persons on the
15 basis of their experience and training; and
16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
17 approve and continue the immediate supervision of the Presiding Judge
18 to remain under the direct guidance of the Chief Judge; and
19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the salary announced on the Job Announcement be
20 listed as "negotiable" allowing for differences in rate of compen-
21 sation depending on previous experience and qualification.

22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th.
23 day of August, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
24 of 1326.5 for; -0- against; 113.5 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant
25 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and (f) and
26 Section 3 (b) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago
27 Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936
28 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 16, 1937, pursuant to
29 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
30 effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago
31 Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.




