

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


Papago Skill Center Budget - FY 85
(Funds from Dept. of Education)

Res No. 196-84

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Skill Center has experienced uncertainty with funding to
2 continue its current operations; and
3 WHEREAS, The Papago Council determined that skill center training and programs
4 was of benefit to participants; and
5 WHEREAS, The Papago Skill Center has submitted a request for continued funding
6 to the Department of Education and has received notification that the
7 request is eligible for funding; and
8 WHEREAS, The Papago Skill Center Director has prepared in accordance the re-
9 quirements of the funding agency the necessary justifications and
10 budgets to be required to continue operations at the level sufficient
11 to meet the needs of training participants; and
12 WHEREAS, The funds will be available for use beginning October 1, 1948 upon
13 approval and execution of required documents; and
14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
15 approve the receipt of funds from the Department of Education to fund
16 and continue the operations of the Skill Center in the amount nego-
17 tiated and agreed upon by the parties to the negotiation; and
18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Vice-Chair-
19 man or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to
20 negotiate and execute any and all documents, and any amendments thereto
21 necessary to receive the funds designated for use by the Skill Center
22 during FY 85.


23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th day
24 of September, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
25 1211.5 for; 203.0 against; and 25.5 not voting; and 1 absent, pur-
26 suant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (f)
27 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona
28 as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved
29 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16
30 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject
31 to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date
32 of its enactment by the Papago Council.
