

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


Multi-Health Complex


1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has been advised of the deteriorated and damaged  
2 condition of the Multi-Health facility as a result of rain seeping  
3 through the roofing system; and  
4 WHEREAS, Repair and maintenance of the facility and associated costs is of  
5 concern to the Papago Council; and  
6 WHEREAS, The Indian Health Service has inspected the facility and concurs in  
7 the status finding and recommends an option of permitting the Indian  
8 Health Service to use space in the building and assume maintenance  
9 and repair responsibilities through a lease; and  
10 WHEREAS, This option appears to be the most economic and viable option; and  
11 NOW , THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Papago Council that it does hereby  
12 approve and accept the option of executing a use permit on the  
13 Multi-Health facility to Indian Health Service for such terms and  
14 conditions as may be agreed upon by the parties.

15 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th,  
16 day of September, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a  
17 vote of 1205.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 2 absent, pur-  
18 suant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) of  
19 Article V of the Constituion and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona  
20 as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved  
21 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, purusuant to Section  
22 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not  
23 subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of  
24 the date of its enactment by the Papago Council,
