

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


Support for Title VI Program to Request for Additional Funds

Res. No. 215-84

- 1 WHEREAS, The Older American Act, Title VI provides for Grants to Indian Tribes
2 for the purpose of delivery of social services, including nutritional
3 services for Indians that are comparable to services provided under
4 Title III; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Title VI Programs are administered by the Department of Health and
6 Human Services, Administration on Aging, Washington, D.C.; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Indian Tribe have participated in the Title VI Program since it's
8 institution in 1981 and through tribal participation many of the tribal
9 senior citizens have benefitted from the services provided under this
10 program; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The annual fiscal year appropriations for the Title VI Programs do not
12 meet the growing needs of the local Indian Programs, and as a result
13 the delivery of services are being restricted; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe is concerned about the continued success of it's
15 Title VI Program and the health and welfare of it's senior citizens
16 who have come to depend upon the nutritional and social services of
17 the Title VI Program; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe recognizes the need for a unified effort of Indian
19 Tribes to collectively solicit support from their Congressional Dele-
20 gates and the representatives of the Administration on Aging, Title
21 VI Federal Representatives to actively and earnestly seek and secure
22 additional funding from the United States Congress for the Title VI
23 Programs to ensure that the provisions of the Older Americans Act are
24 being followed and implemented; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe acknowledges the improved quality of the health and
26 welfare of it's senior citizens, this improvement can be credited in
27 part to their participation in the Title VI Program; and
- 28 WHEREAS, The growing needs of the Papago Tribe Title VI Program have resulted
29 in increased operating costs for the Program, these costs matched
30 against the Federal Funds are not sufficient to continue to provide
31 the quality of social and nutritional services that the senior citizen
32 are entitled to; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council does hereby respect-
fully request Senator Goldwater, Senator DeConcini, Congressman Udall,
and Congressman McCain to request a written report from the Adminis-
tration on Aging, Title VI Program which would reflect the number of
Indian Programs, their FY 85 application funding request and the
actual FY 85 contract allocation and the amount of the Tribes unmet
needs for FY 85 and upon receipt of this report introduce legislation
that would provide for a supplemental appropriation for the Title VI
Programs nationwide.


1 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th.
2 day of October, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
3 of 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant
4 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V
5 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
6 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Sec-
7 retary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
8 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review
9 by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its en-
10 actment by the Papago Council.
