

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
Start Getting our Minutes for our Next Council Meeting

Res. No. 216-84

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has operated as a legislative body for over forty
2 years and enacted legislation affecting the lives of its members; and

3 WHEREAS, The Papago Council is responsible for any and all legislative action
4 it takes by addressing and responding to questions from its constit-
5 uency; and

6 WHEREAS, Memorializing of Council action through mechanical means and through
7 notetaking by a secretary has preserved such for future reference; and


8 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has not received minutes of its Council meetings in
9 the recent past and cannot refer to previous actions when the need
10 arises; and

11 WHEREAS, It is in the interest of the Papago Council to have timely minutes
12 prepared by the Secretary for review and approval; and


13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby directs the
14 Tribal Council Secretary to prepare minutes of previous meetings, in
15 the format she determines appropriate, for review by the Papago Coun-
16 cil at their regularly scheduled meetings, this directive to begin
17 with October month's council meeting.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th.
19 day of October, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
20 of 702.0 for; 324.0 against; 414.0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant
21 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) of Article V
22 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
23 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Sec-
24 retary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
25 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review
26 by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its en-
27 actment by the Papago Council.
