

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


Funding Approval for Two Weeks for Programs from Tribal Funds

Res. No. 220-84

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe is presently operating the Employment Assistance,
2 Higher Education, Children's Home and Agriculture Extension under
3 funds contracted from the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and
4 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has requested the Bureau of Indian Affairs to con-
5 tract with the Papago Tribe under P.L. 93-638 regulations and pro-
6 cedures for the operation of these programs; and
7 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has learned that the Area Office will not have the
8 above listed contracts ready for signature by October 1, 1984; and
9 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has consistently refused to fund or operate pro-
10 grams funded by 93-638 contract funds if the Bureau of Indian Affairs
11 has not executed and signed the contracts prior to the start of the
12 fiscal year; and
13 WHEREAS, The Papago Council believes these programs to be beneficial and in
14 the interest of the Papago people to operate the programs without
15 any break in the delivery of services; and
16 WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs gave their verbal assurance before
17 witnesses that they would sign these contracts; and
18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby agrees to
19 waive its position of not funding or operating any contracted pro-
20 gram if contracts are not signed and executed by the Bureau of Indian
21 Affairs prior to the start of the fiscal year and hereby agrees to
22 fund the Employment Assistance, Higher Education, Children's Home
23 and Agriculture Extension for a period of two weeks.


24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th.
25 day of October, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
26 of 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to
27 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (f) of Article
28 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
29 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Sec-
30 retary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
31 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review
32 by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its en-
actment by the Papago Council.
