

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


Farm Board
Waiver for annual report until February

Res. No. 229-84

1 WHEREAS, The Plan of Operations for the Papago Farm Board provides that an
2 annual report will be submitted to the Papago Council to report on
3 the status of the Papago Farms; and
4 WHEREAS, This annual report will include a report on the proposed budget for
5 the upcoming fiscal year and a audit report for FY 84; and
6 WHEREAS, The Farming Authority has not been able to develop the report in
7 such a manner that will fully advise the Papago Council of the
8 status of Papago farms; and
9 WHEREAS, The Farming Authority Board is desirous of an extension until Feb-
10 ruary 1985, before it reports to the Papago Council; and
11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby find
12 the reasons for the request of an extension in reporting to the
13 Papago Council the status of the Papago Farming Authority sufficient
14 and hereby grant the extension until February, 1985.


15 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th.
16 day of November, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
17 of 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant
18 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and (f) of
19 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
20 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
21 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
22 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
23 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
24 its enactment by the Papago Council.
