

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Acceptance of the Proposed three forms of government
Legislative Executive, & Article IV



1 WHEREAS, The Constitution Committee of the Papago Council has been directed
2 by the Papago Council to revise the Papago Constitution of 1937 in
3 the form it has deemed appropriate for the Papago Tribe; and
4 WHEREAS, The Constitution Committee has this 5th day of April presented a
5 final draft of the proposed Papago Constituion which will rescind,
6 if passed, the 1937 Constitution; and
7 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has reviewed the proposed draft and agrees to the
8 three proposed forms of government as provided in Article IV of the
9 draft;


10 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby approves
11 the change in governing structure and authority to separate the
12 functions of the Legislative, the Judicial and the Executive, each
13 having equal power, into three separate branches of government.

14 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
15 day of April, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a
16 vote of 695.5 for; 348.5 against; 396.0 not voting; and 0 absent,
17 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2
18 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe
19 of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
20 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
21 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
22 not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of
23 the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
