

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Authorizing an Intergovernmental Agreement with
State of Arizona, Department of Economic
Security re: Targeted Jobs Tax Credit

RES. NO. 54-84

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has been informed of the targeted jobs tax credit
2 program available to private employees who hire semi-skilled workers;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, The Papago Council is aware that unemployment among Papagos is high
5 and agrees that all efforts must be taken to help alleviate this
6 condition; and

7 WHEREAS, The tax credit program would provide an incentive to private employers
8 to hire semi-skilled workers and provide the necessary training to
9 enhance their positions; and


10 WHEREAS, The Papago Council finds that T.E.R.O. is able and willing to take on
11 the responsibilities associated with certifying workers under this
12 program;

13 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby approve
14 the targeted jobs tax credit program and authorizes an intergovernmen-
15 tal agreement with the State of Arizona, through the Department of
16 Economic Security, to provide certification and vouchering of eligible
17 employees to private employers, and related activities;

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Vice-Chirman
19 or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, are hereby authorized and directed to
20 negotiate and execute any and all documents, required and necessary,
21 and any amendments thereto.


22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 4th
23 day of April, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
24 of 1440.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 3 absent,
25 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and
26 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona
27 as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved
28 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16
29 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
30 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its
31 enactment by the Papago Council.
