RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Authorizing a 93-638 Contract with Bureau of Reclamation

1	WHEREAS,	Public Law 97-293, Southern Arizona Water Rights Settlement Act.
2		provides for meeting the water needs of the Papago Tribe on the
3		San Xavier Reservation and the Schuk Toak District of the Sells
4		Reservation, and
	WHEREAS,	Public Law 97-293 provides that the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Bureau of Reclamation, shall design and construct
5		within the San Xavier Reservation such canals, laterals, farm
6		ditches and irrigation works as are necessary for the efficient
7		distribution for agricultural purposes of the water referred to
8		in subparagraph (A) of the Act (27,000 acre feet), and
9	WHEREAS,	The Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Bureau of
		Reclamation, shall design and construct an irrigation system in
10		the Eastern Schuk Toak District of the Sells Reservation, including
11		such canals, laterals, farm ditches, and irrigation works, as are necessary for the efficient distribution for agricultural purposes
12		of the water referred to in subparagraph (A) of the Act (10,800 acre
13		feet), and
14	WHEREAS,	the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Bureau of Reclamation
15		shall establish a water management plan for the San Xavier Reservation
16		and the Schuk Toak District of the Papago Reservation which, except
		as is necessary to be consistent with the provisions of Title III
17		of P.L. 97-293, will have the same effect as any management plan developed under Arizona law, and
18	WHEREAS,	to make available and deliver reclaimed exchange water (Reclaimed
19		exchange water, 23,000 acre feet to San Xavier and 5,200 acre feet
20	in the second	to Schuk Toak), the Secretary, acting through the Bureau of
21		Reclamation, shall design, construct, operate, maintain, and replace
22	HUEDEAC	such facilities as are appropriate (On-Reservation portion), and
	WHEKEAS,	the Secretary of the Interior is authorized to determine which lands within the Gila Bend Reservation have been rendered unsuitable
23		for agriculture by reason of the operation of Painted Rock Dam and
24		to exchange such lands for an equivalent acreage of land under his
25		jurisdiction which are within the Federal public domain and which,
26		but for their suitability for agriculture, are of like quality, and
27	WHEREAS,	the most timely method of conducting the necessary studies and designs
28		would be for the Papago Tribe of Arizona to provide for services under a P.L. 93-638 Contract.
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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribe does hereby apply for negotiate, and execute a contract under P. L. 93-638 with the Secretary of the Interior, subject to the Tribal laws, codes, and regulations applying to such things, to conduct studies necessary to identify and evaluate reasonable alternatives available to meet the mandates of P. L. 97-293 and to perform all engineering studies required to implement the terms of P. L. 97-293 and to provide all incidental administrative services.

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Josiah Moore, Chairman, or in his absence, 8 Francisco Jose Jr., Vice-Chairman, or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, be 9 designated to negotiate and to execute the contract and any amendments 8 thereto, and that the designation shall terminate September 30, 1986

10 unless terminated earlier by Council action.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proposed contract shall start

and run untill September 30, 1986.

Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
