

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Authorizing a 93-638 Contract with
Bureau of Reclamation

RES. NO. 56-84

1 WHEREAS, Public Law 97-293, Southern Arizona Water Rights Settlement Act.
2 provides for meeting the water needs of the Papago Tribe on the
3 San Xavier Reservation and the Schuk Toak District of the Sells
Reservation, and

4 WHEREAS, Public Law 97-293 provides that the Secretary of the Interior,
5 acting through the Bureau of Reclamation, shall design and construct
6 within the San Xavier Reservation such canals, laterals, farm
7 ditches and irrigation works as are necessary for the efficient
8 distribution for agricultural purposes of the water referred to
in subparagraph (A) of the Act (27,000 acre feet), and

9 WHEREAS, The Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Bureau of
10 Reclamation, shall design and construct an irrigation system in
11 the Eastern Schuk Toak District of the Sells Reservation, including
12 such canals, laterals, farm ditches, and irrigation works, as are
13 necessary for the efficient distribution for agricultural purposes
of the water referred to in subparagraph (A) of the Act (10,800 acre
feet), and

14 WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Bureau of Reclamation
15 shall establish a water management plan for the San Xavier Reservation
16 and the Schuk Toak District of the Papago Reservation which, except
17 as is necessary to be consistent with the provisions of Title III
of P.L. 97-293, will have the same effect as any management plan
18 developed under Arizona law, and

19 WHEREAS, to make available and deliver reclaimed exchange water (Reclaimed
20 exchange water, 23,000 acre feet to San Xavier and 5,200 acre feet
21 to Schuk Toak), the Secretary, acting through the Bureau of
Reclamation, shall design, construct, operate, maintain, and replace
22 such facilities as are appropriate (On-Reservation portion), and

23 WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Interior is authorized to determine which
24 lands within the Gila Bend Reservation have been rendered unsuitable
25 for agriculture by reason of the operation of Painted Rock Dam and
26 to exchange such lands for an equivalent acreage of land under his
jurisdiction which are within the Federal public domain and which,
but for their suitability for agriculture, are of like quality, and

27 WHEREAS, the most timely method of conducting the necessary studies and designs
28 would be for the Papago Tribe of Arizona to provide for services
29 under a P.L. 93-638 Contract.
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
1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribe does hereby apply for
2 negotiate, and execute a contract under P. L. 93-638 with the
3 Secretary of the Interior, subject to the Tribal laws, codes, and
4 regulations applying to such things, to conduct studies necessary to
5 identify and evaluate reasonable alternatives available to meet the
6 mandates of P. L. 97-293 and to perform all engineering studies
7 required to implement the terms of P. L. 97-293 and to provide all
8 incidental administrative services.

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Josiah Moore, Chairman, or in his absence,
8 Francisco Jose Jr., Vice-Chairman, or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, be
9 designated to negotiate and to execute the contract and any amendments
10 thereto, and that the designation shall terminate September 30, 1986
11 unless terminated earlier by Council action.


11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proposed contract shall start _____
12 and run until September 30, 1986.

12 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th
13 day of April, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
14 of 1333.0 for; 0 against; 107.0 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant to the
15 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V
16 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
17 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment
by the Papago Council.
