

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


(Obtain a legal opinion from the Tribal Attorney


1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has been advised of the provision of the proposed
2 Criminal Code; and
3 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has been further advised of the loss of privileges
4 and civil rights by persons convicted of certain felonious crimes;
5 and
6 WHEREAS, The Papago Council is desirous of implementing the same type of
7 policy for convicted felons but to the extent of denying or revoking
8 membership rights and privileges in the Papago Tribe; and
9 WHEREAS, The Papago Council recognized its obligation to make informed decisions
10 to avoid discriminatory or unfair decisions; and
11 WHEREAS, The Papago Council is obligated to determine whether this proposed
12 policy will be in violation or any laws or regulations.
13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby directs
14 the Tribal Attorneys to render a legal opinion of the proposed policy
15 of disenrolling tribal members who have been convicted of major crimes,
16 the purpose being to deny or revoke any privileges or benefits
17 associated with tribal membership.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 9th
19 day of May, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
20 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to the
21 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) and (i) of Article V
22 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
23 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
24 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
25 June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
26 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
27 the Papago Council.
