

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
(Transfer of Buildings to Gu Achi District)

Res. No. 84-84

1 WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs maintains plant facilities, further  
2 identified as Kindergarten building #445 and building #446, located  
3 at the old Santa Rosa School Complex, for which it has no further  
4 need; and

4 WHEREAS, The Gu Achi District Council has by Resolution, a copy is attached  
5 hereto and made a part hereof, advised the Papago Council that the  
6 Gu Achi District has proposed utilization of the buildings; and


6 WHEREAS, the Acting Superintendent of the BIA Papago Agency has released the  
7 buildings, that the Gu Achi District Council will assume financial  
8 responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the buildings,  
9 for any additional property installed therein and for any needed  
10 modifications or renovations thereto; and

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby  
11 authorize, approve and request transfer of the property, identified  
12 as Kindergarten building #445 and building #446 located at the old  
13 Santa Rosa School Complex, to the Gu Achi District in accordance  
14 with the aforementioned advice and Resolution of the Gu Achi District  
15 Council.


15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby authorize  
16 and direct the Chairman and other appropriate officers of the Papago  
17 Tribe and Gu Achi District, on behalf of the Papago Tribe and Gu Achi  
18 District, to execute such documents and take such action as in necess-  
19 ary or proper to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.

19 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th  
20 day of May, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a  
21 vote of 1440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 1 absent  
22 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a)  
23 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of  
24 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and  
25 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to  
26 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is  
27 not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as  
28 of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
