

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Acceptance of Gila Bend Reservation Land
Study 638 Contract

Res. No. 89-84

1 WHEREAS, Section 308 of Title III of Public Law 97-293 (Southern Arizona Water
2 Rights Settlement Act of 1982) authorized and directed the study of
3 lands within the Gila Bend Reservation that have been rendered un-
4 suitable for agriculture by reason of the operation of Painted Rock
5 Dam; exchange of these lands and addition of the new lands to the
6 Reservation; and

7 WHEREAS, a BIA study has been completed as to number of acres within the bound-
8 aries of the Gila Bend Reservation that have been rendered unsuitable
9 for agriculture by reason of the operation of Painted Rock Dam; and

10 WHEREAS, there exists, within the BIA budget at the present time, the sum of
11 \$100,000.00 allocated for the study of suitable land available for
12 exchange of Reservation land as provided for in the Act; and


13 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has, by written request, notified the BIA of its
14 intention to contract this study under the provisions of the Indian
15 Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (88 Stat. 2203, 25
16 U.S.C. 450); and

17 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Papago Tribe that this contract be
18 negotiated and executed as soon as possible.


19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council does hereby
20 authorize and direct the Chairman, Vice Chairman and Treasurer of the
21 Tribe to negotiate and execute a P.L. 93-638 contract, and any amend-
22 ments thereto, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for the study of suitable
23 land available for exchange of Reservation land rendered unsuitable
24 for agriculture by reason of the operation of Painted Rock Dam.

25 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 22nd
26 day of May, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
27 1333.0 for; 53.5 against; 53.5 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to the
28 authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the constitu-
29 tion and by-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe
30 on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January
31 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
32 Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and
is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
