


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

Acceptance of the Judicial Services
P.L. 93-638 FY 1985 Budget Contract



1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe of Arizona is presently operating the Judicial
2 Services under FY 1984 P. L. 93-638 contract with the Bureau of
3 Indian Affairs; and
4 WHEREAS, such Tribal operations have been successful and beneficial to the
5 Papago Tribe and its people; and
6 WHEREAS, 25 CFR Sec. 271.20 of the Federal Regulations requires that all
7 proposals to recontract under P. L. 93-638 be submitted to the
8 Tribal Council for approval at least 120 days prior to the contract
9 termination; and
10 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council does desire to recontract for provision
11 of these services during FY 1985; and
12 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has reviewed and approved the Judicial
13 Services contract.
14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does authorize
15 and request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract with the
16 Papago Tribe under P. L. 93-638 regulations and procedures for the
17 provision of services titled Judicial Services.
18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of this contract shall commence on
19 October 01, 1984 and end September 30, 1985.
20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Tribe will not fund or operate
21 programs from which contracts are requested herewith which have
22 not been negotiated and executed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs
23 prior to the start of the funding year.
24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Jr.,
25 Vice Chairman or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council
26 is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute these contracts
27 and any amendments thereto for the duration of the contracts.
28 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 22nd
29 day of May, 1984, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
30 of 1386.5 for; -0- against; 53.5 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant
31 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d), and (m)
32 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona
as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved
by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16
of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject
to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date
of its enactment by the Papago Council.
