

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Opposition to proposed reductions or terminations of
Certain Federal Programs)

RES. NO. 169-86

1 WHEREAS, The Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (P. L.
2 99-177) requires that budget deficits must be reduced each year
3 beginning with FY 1986 through FY 1991 by setting maximum deficit
4 target amounts to be met each year; and

6 WHEREAS, An automatic spending reduction process is triggered to eliminate
7 excess deficits through sequestering of budget authorities; and

8 WHEREAS, The President has proposed the FY 1987 Federal budget taking into
9 consideration the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit control
10 Act mandate; and

11 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has learned of proposed reductions and termination
12 of certain BIA AND IHS, programs including: J.O.M; Construction;
13 HIP; Facilities Improvement and Repair; Health Services &
14 Facilities Construction; CHR; Urban Health and Legal Services.


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16 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe currently operates programs which will be severely
17 affected by any reductions or terminations in existing programs; and

18 WHEREAS, Reductions or terminations of these programs will effectively
19 frustrate the Tribe's efforts and developments in these areas;

20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
21 strongly oppose the reduction or termination of the above listed
22 programs and respectfully urges the Congress to review the merits
23 of the President's justification for the proposed reductions or
24 terminations and to restore the programs with full budget authority
25 at the current or greater levels.

27 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th
28 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
29 of 1640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
30 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of
31 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
32 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment
by the Papago Council.
