

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(In Support of U.S. BORDER PATROL AND U.S. CUSTOMS)

RES. NO. 171-86

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has become aware of increasing law enforcement  
2 problems such as rustling, drug smuggling, illegal entries onto the  
3 Papago Reservation and other theft-related offenses and which can be  
4 directly attributed to the International Boundary bordering the  
5 Papago Reservation for 90 miles; and  
6

7 WHEREAS, The Papago Council is concerned that funding reductions as a result of  
8 the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 will  
9 severely impact or curtail the minimal coverage now being provided by  
10 the U.S. Border Patrol and U.S. Customs Service along the  
11 International boundary; and

13 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe would like to see the U.S. Border Patrol man its'  
14 housing unit in the village of Sells in a 24 hour basis to assist the  
15 U.S. Customs Service and the Papago Police Department in their effort  
16 to deter border related activities and provide responsive services  
17 when necessary; and

19 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe is desirous of establishing a coordinating and  
20 working network between the U.S. Border Patrol, U.S. Customs Service  
21 and the Papago Police Department to enable and facilitate adequate  
22 coverage and deterrent effect, and to assure the residents of those  
23 Districts bordering or near the International boundary of ready access  
24 to law enforcement personnel in case of an emergency or need; and


26 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe encourages and recommends to Congress to scrutinize  
27 any attempts or proposals by the President to reduce funding of the  
28 U.S. Border Patrol or the U.S. Custom and to restore or continue  
29 funding for both of these agencies at the same level or higher levels  
30 of funding;

31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby  
32 request and recommend to Congress to direct and authorize the


1 officials of the U.S. Border Patrol and U.S. Customs to meet with  
2 tribal officials to begin to discuss the logistics of providing  
3 adequate and responsive coverage to the Papago Reservation especially  
4 those Districts bordering or near the International Boundary to deter  
5 or prevent criminal activities related to the border, and the Papago  
6 Council further urges and recommends to Congress to continue funding  
7 to both these agencies at a level to enable them to provide responsive  
8 and adequate coverage to the Papago Reservation.

10 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th  
11 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote  
12 of 1386.5 for; 184.5 against; 69.0 not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the  
13 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article  
14 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,  
15 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary  
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June  
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary  
of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the  
Papago Council.
