officials of the U.S. Border Patrol and U.S. Customs to meet with tribal officials to begin to discuss the logistics of providing adequate and responsive coverage to the Papago Reservation especially those Districts bordering or near the International Boundary to deter or prevent criminal activities related to the border, and the Papago Council further urges and recommends to Congress to continue funding to both these agencies at a level to enable them to provide responsive and adequate coverage to the Papago Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1386.5 for; 184.5 against; 69.0 not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
